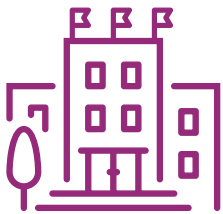

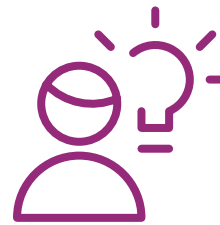
Members of the First Responder Network from all faculties and many central units, colleges and institutes.

**700+**

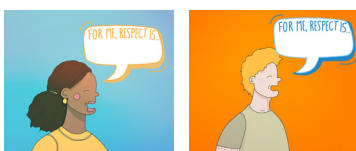
Staff trained across all faculties and many central units, colleges and institutes.

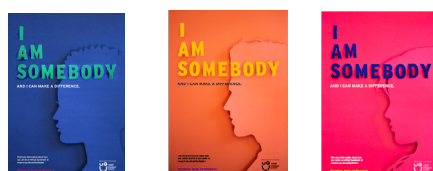
